3. Summer Programs

The summer programs, encompassing academics and enrichment classes at 26 schools with over 1000 students were very successful.

Filipe Andre provided a brief report on awards that were given to students in the JROTC program.

Individual members of the School Committee provided brief reports of activities attended since the previous meeting.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Pope and seconded by Mrs. Ussach, to receive and place on file the Superintendent's, Student Representative's and School Committee reports.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Atty. Clark, and seconded by Mr. Nobrega to receive and place on file the Curriculum and School Building Sub-Committee Reports

At this time, Dr. Mark Smith, Director of the Ocean Explorium at New Bedford Seaport, gave a presentation on the educational program offerings at the Explorium located on Union St. in New Bedford.

A Motion was made by Mr. Pope and seconded by Atty. Clark to approve the second and final reading of policy IKB – Homework Policy.

At this time, Dr. Fletcher asked that another statement be added to the policy. Dr. Bonner reminded the Chair, Mayor Lang, that it was inappropriate at this time to edit the policy. As instructed by Mayor Lang at the School Committee meeting on July 13, 2009, Committee members were to contact the Superintendent's Office in writing with any further comments and/or changes. The policies would then be updated and then brought forth for approval.

Mayor Lang disagreed and said that he instructed the Committee to bring proposed changes to the next meeting to discuss. Dr. Bonner pointed out that the minutes of the July 13, 2009 meeting did reflect that Committee members were instructed to submit changes in writing to the Superintendent's Office, therefore the minutes should be amended if they were in error, under Robert's Rules of Order, before the Committee proceeded further with the approval of the deliberation of the policies. No motion was made.

Mayor Lang instructed Dr. Fletcher to proceed with his recommendation for an added statement in the homework policy as follows: *"The Committee expects parents to provide a suitable place for students to do their homework and to monitor their children by questioning them upon the completion of their assignments"*.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mrs. Ussach and seconded by Mr. Pope to approve policy IKB – Homework Policy, as amended.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Nobrega and seconded by Mr. Pope to approve policy IKE – Elementary Promotion Policy.

A motion was made by Mrs. Ussach and seconded by Mr. Pope to approve the second and final reading of policy IICC – Field Trips.

At this time Atty. Clark recommended the addition of a statement that reflects the fact that a field trip is a privilege and that principals, along with the approval of the Superintendent, should have the right to deny this privilege if a student is a disciplinary problem. Further, the principal should have the option to call the parent and explain that the student is not ready to attend. A letter should then go home to the parent.

Dr. Bonner said that this should not be a policy, but rather regulated by the principals. She also stated that she would like to see it stay as the principals' call and not something regulated by a policy.

Atty. Clark understood and asked if a statement could be added that mentions: *The School Committee recognizes that Field Trips are a privilege.*

It was further mentioned that the School Committee should receive a report from all teachers regarding the field trip taken and that the field trip form be updated with an area to write the report.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Atty. Clark and seconded by Mr. Nobrega to approve policy IICA – Field Trips, as amended.

Mayor Lang appointed the following members to the newly established Transportation Sub-Committee:

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Dr. Fletcher and seconded by Mr. Nobrega to approve a building usage request from the Board of Election Commissioners to use portions of seven (7) schools as polling places for the Municipal Preliminary on 10/6/09 and Municipal election on 11/3/09.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Nobrega and seconded by Mr. Pope to approve a building usage request from the Inter-Church Council of Greater New Bedford, in conjunction with the New Bedford Public Schools, to use the auditorium and community room at Keith Middle School for parental information exhibition booths on September 1, 2009 from 6-9:30 PM with waiver of all fees.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Dr. Fletcher and seconded by Atty. Clark to approve a building usage request from David Ponte, SouthCoast Aquatics, to use the swimming pool at New Bedford High School for New Bedford Public School students, ages 11 – 18 for safety/training classes from September 8, 2009 – July 23, 2010, on Monday/Wed./Friday, 6:30 – 7:45 P.M. with waiver of all fees.

Mayor Lang stated that the city is in need of trained Lifeguards and was pleased that this program would be available to young people in New Bedford.

Dr. Bonner pointed out, on the recommendation of Michael Correia/Athletic Director, that the time should be changed from the original request of 5:45 – 7:15 P.M. to accommodate the New Bedford High School swim program and wanted to have assurance that our students will not be displaced. Mr. Correia, through Dr. Bonner, also stated that since fees were being charged with half going to the instructor, that this is similar to any sports camp that must pay fees.

Mr. Ponte and Mr. Verran of SouthCoast Aquatics were invited to speak on the issue. They gave a lengthy explanation on their program and their credentials and clarified that their only goal was to provide the opportunity to New Bedford youth to have a place to receive training/safety classes at a low cost and to have a place for swim athletes to practice. Mr. Ponte also mentioned that they are a 501C non-profit organization and that the fee for the courses is \$300 per student.

Mr. Pope questioned whether there was scholarship money available to help under privileged children. Mr. Ponte said that the registration fee of \$60 could be waived for students who are enrolled in the free lunch program, but they were unable to offer more at this time. They assured Mr. Pope that as the program grew, they may be able to offer some assistance in the future.

Dr. Bonner pointed out that under contract, in order to waive custodial fees, all students must be New Bedford Public School students. Mr. Ponte assured the Committee that students would be from NBPS and that they would agree to the schedule change.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Nobrega and seconded by Atty. Clark, to approve an out of state travel request from Donna Guay, History Teacher/NBHS, to attend the Community Service Learning Conference in Auburn, ME from August 11-14, 2009 at a cost of \$1324 to be paid out of the CSL Sustainability School-Based Grants.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mrs. Ussach and seconded by Atty. Clark, to approve an out of state travel request from Lisa Pratt, Science Teacher/Roosevelt Middle School, to attend the Community Service Learning Conference in Auburn, ME from August 11-14, 2009 at a cost of \$1450 to be paid out of the CSL Sustainability School-Based Grants.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Pope and seconded by Mrs. Ussach to take up three items on the addendum.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Dr. Fletcher and seconded by Mrs. Ussach to approve a request by Susan Campinha-Beck/Principal/Dunbar, Bartholomew Lush/Principal/Hathaway and Steven Machado/Principal/Congdon to

have a color map of the United States painted on the playground areas of their respective schools by the Verizon Pioneers with no cost to their schools or the district.

A motion was made by Mrs. Ussach and seconded by Mr. Nobrega, to approve a request by the Savoy Nursing & Rehabilitation Center for permission to use New Bedford High School as an evacuation center in the event of an emergency/disaster.

Atty. Clark questioned whether the City's Emergency Management was aware of this arrangement and wanted to make sure there was no conflict. They Mayor suggested tabling the issue until the next meeting so he could look into the potential conflicts with the City departments.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Nobrega and seconded by Mrs. Ussach, to table a request by the Savoy Nursing & Rehabilitation Center for permission to use New Bedford High School as an evacuation center in the event of an emergency/disaster.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Pope and seconded by Mrs. Ussach to approve a request by the Greater New Bedford Workforce Investment Board Youth Council to use the Community Room at Normandin Middle School on 9/1/09 and Keith Middle School Community Room on 12/1/09, 3/2/10, 5/4/10 & 6/1/10 for their quarterly/annual meetings from 3:30 -5:30 P.M. with a waiver of all fees.

At this time, Mr. Pope inquired of the Superintendent, a clarification on how the out of district transfer requests were processed this year. Dr. Bonner explained the Magnet School process, saying that parents submitted applications and students were picked by lottery. Pulaski School and Carney Academy did not include kindergarten in the Magnet Curriculum; therefore no students from outside the Pulaski or Carney district could attend kindergarten at those schools. She said this may have lead to siblings being separated. Dr. Bonner went on to point out that class sizes would be affected this year by staff changes due to budget cuts and that in order to keep classes from becoming too large, she had to deny some parents who had filed for an out of district transfer.

Atty. Clark asked Dr. Bonner about the number of requests and how many of them were denied. Dr. Bonner said that as of June 1, there were 386 requests, 63 of which were denied but as circumstances changed, she has approved some of the previous denials. She also mentioned that in some cases, principals asked that a child not return due to either an attendance or disciplinary issue.

Atty. Clark suggested that the soon to be hired Outreach Coordinator work with parents to explain the intent of the Superintendent's reasons and that have a hardship to see what arrangements

Dr. Bonner also explained that parents and teachers, especially from Winslow School, have voiced their concerns to her in the past regarding large class sizes due to out of district students being allowed to transfer into schools with large numbers. It was felt that class size issues could be alleviated if all parents re-applied; the district would then adjust accordingly.

Dr. Fletcher voiced his concern that parents were unaware of, or did not understand the policy and this has led to many complaints.

Mayor Lang suggested that the out of district policy decisions were not precipitated by class size and that the decisions might have been made arbitrarily. He then proposed that Dr. Bonner and Dr. Souza, along with a working group of School Committee members should review why the applications were denied to see if something could be done to accommodate parents with hardships.

Dr. Bonner said she would re-examine the 63 denials herself along with class size numbers and approve as many as possible. She stated that if the Committee wanted open enrollment for the district, they should develop a policy regarding the issue. The new application policy was clearly announced by letters to parents, the School Department website and the Standard Times. She explained that she also has to work with principals who made promises to parents without going through the School Department and now there is a breach of communication.

Mayor Lang again stated his recommendation and added that the working group of School Committee members would examine each application individually to see if there is merit to requests made by parents and see if there were promises made by principals, but does not want families uprooted. Mayor Lang called for a motion and recommended that Mr. Pope, Mr. Nobrega and Mrs. Ussach work with Dr. Bonner and Dr. Souza on this issue as soon as possible.

Dr. Bonner emphatically disagreed with this recommendation; stating that School Committee members do not work on managerial tasks and thought it inappropriate for them to do so. She again stated that she would write letters of approval for those previously denied and work to move staff around to adjust. She then mentioned that the School Committee was going against their own policy regarding district lines.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Atty. Clark, and seconded by Dr. Fletcher, to form a working group, consisting of School Committee members, Mr. Pope, Mr. Nobrega and Mrs. Ussach, Dr. Bonner, Superintendent and Dr. Souza, Deputy Superintendent, to meet in the Superintendent's Office as soon as possible to review Student Out of District applications that have been denied by the Superintendent.

Mayor Lang asked that another School Committee meeting be held on August, 24, 2009.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Dr. Fletcher and seconded by Atty. Clark, to hold the next regular School Committee meeting on Monday, August 24, 2009 at Keith Middle School at 7:00 P.M.

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Atty. Clark and seconded by Mr. Nobrega, to receive and place on file a communication from the Massachusetts School Building Authority regarding the Feasibility Study of Hannigan School.

At 8:59 P.M., on a motion by Mrs. Ussach and seconded by Dr. Fletcher, the meeting was adjourned.
